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# The Concept...

## Hull is the 2017 UK City of Culture...

- A Curriculum designed to celebrate Hull's rich cultural and historic assets.
- Evoke a deep sense of pride and appreciation of the unique city in which we live.
- Bring the history and culture of Hull to life for primary school pupils.
- Support Hull teachers to enrich the delivery of the primary curriculum.
- Inspire children to develop their knowledge and support development of key skills and personal aspiration.

# Progress to date...

**April 2014** Heritage Learning carried out initial consultation with the 41 schools

**July 2014** Heritage Learning delivered a curriculum planning week with the 41 schools to develop initial Hull Curriculum content, creative interpretations and resource requirements.

**September 2014** Education Programme Developer recruited, established Hull Curriculum Teacher Focus Group.

**December 2014** Heritage Learning recruited digital design company, Grapple.

**January – July 2015** worked with design company and focus group to translate the vision and teacher consultation into a concept for a digital platform for the Hull Curriculum. Wider steering group of partners from across the city established including; Heritage Learning, Hull Museums, Hull Civic Society, 2017 Team and Hull University.

**August – October 2015** Hull Curriculum Digital Platform build

# Next Steps...

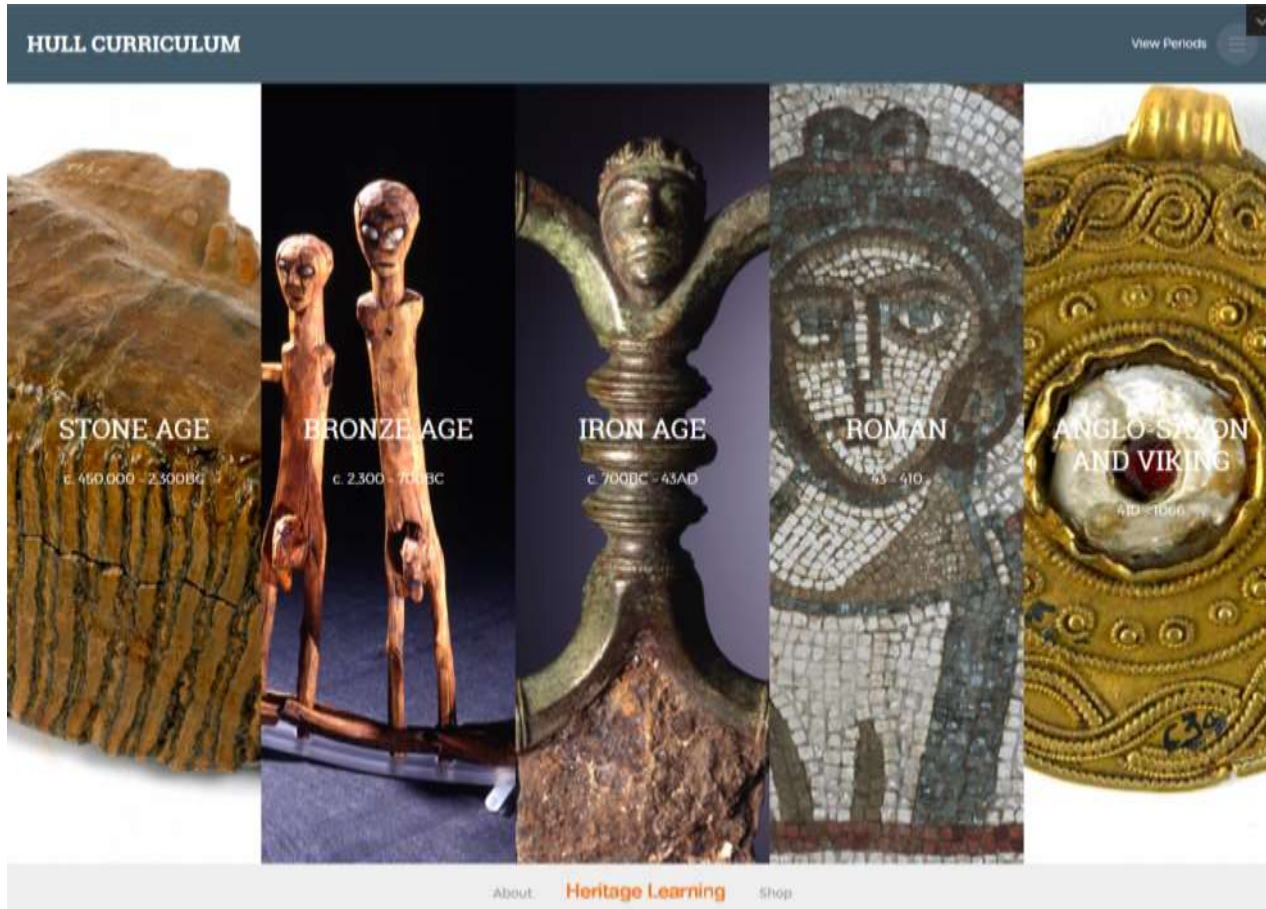
**November 2015** Establish Hull Curriculum digital platform content ready for 2017. Twenty histories about Hull every child should learn before they leave Primary school.

**January 2016** Seek financial support to develop creative interpretations of the twenty key histories.

Work with artists, illustrators, writers, poets, film-makers and twenty schools to enable pupils to learn about and develop their own creative interpretations of these top 20 histories.

**September 2016 / January 2017** Full launch of the Hull Curriculum


